Keynote Speaker

Dr. Hopi Lovell Martin is of mixed Lenni Lenape, Briton, and European ancestry. Born in Massachusetts, but raised in Tkaronto (Toronto) where he belongs to the Ojibwe Nation through his Auntie and Traditional Teacher, Jacque Lavallee from Shawanaga First Nation. Through these relations, he is Oshkaabewis (Sacred Helper, Messenger, Fire Keeper, Lodge Caretaker), roles which he extended into his PhD research: 'Listening to Land as Teacher in Early Childhood Education.'

Saturday Workshops

Workshop 1: Supporting the Integration of Exceptional Students in the Classroom

As more students with exceptionalities are integrated in the classroom and with the recent prolonged school closures due to COVID-19, it is essential that educators are supported when accommodating and/ or modifying programs for students with special needs. This workshop will provide educators with examples, strategies and resources on how to embed accommodations and/or modifications into a student's program and ensure integration and learning is successful for all.

Workshop 2: Student Mental Health and Wellbeing

As the number of students with special needs in the regular classroom increases, it is essential that educators are supported in working with these students and their unique needs. This workshop will focus on developing student mental health and wellbeing awareness and strategies to support student mental health and well-being.

Workshop 3: Preparing for Play: Strategies for Spending Time in Kindergarten Classrooms

Kindergarten classrooms may not look, sound, or feel like other classrooms, but they are places where joy, wonder, and learning happen every single day through hands-on play and inquiry! In this session, participants will expand their understanding of the Kindergarten Program and come away with a variety of knowledge, skills, and strategies for the field. From exploring the 4 Four Frames of Learning to investigating ways to document learning in play, we will work together and add to our toolkits - being ready, confident, and even excited, to jump into the magic of a Kindergarten classroom.



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
