Even though the membership ratified the current local Collective Agreement (CA) at the end of 2021, that CA expired August 31, 2022. However, it remains in place and active until the bargaining process with the TDSB is complete and a new agreement is ratified by the membership.

So, your local's Collective Bargaining team will be heading back into bargaining with the TDSB this school year. Before they do, the local executive will be creating a survey that will be sent and made available to all local members. The local wants your input and to know what you believe the priorities should be.

ETFO Provincial began central bargaining in the summer and have dates scheduled into September. ## Keeping Our OTs Safe: Zero Touch Policy

THROWBACK ALERT! This article was published in the 2012, 2016 and 2017 Dispatch and remains an important message to all Occasional Teachers in the TDSB. The TDSB has [a clear] policy of 'no touch' when employees interact with students, particularly when it relates to discipline or classroom control. For this reason, it is critical that all members take precautionary steps to avoid any physical contact with students.

Any time a teacher, particularly an Occasional Teacher, crosses the boundaries around touch, they are putting themselves at **risk** of an allegation of physical harm or emotional trauma (PR 560). There is **no safe touch** in the relationship between a teacher and a student no matter how innocent or well-meaning your intentions. You cannot anticipate either the reaction or interpretation of the child or their parent(s)/guardian(s).



The stress on a member who faces an allegation cannot be overstated. Don't put yourself at risk.
